TOYS ON WHEELS: A community project in collaboration with *Food From The Heart* (FFTH)

The “Toys on Wheels” project was started three years ago by an organization called *Food From The Heart* (FFTH) by a Swiss couple whose main objective was to collect food for needy families in Singapore. It collected unsold bread from bakeries and delivered them to needy families and Homes in Singapore. The programme, now in its fourth year (with ACSP participating since 2005), has extended to include collection of toys/games. This programme involves the expression of giving from the heart, from pupil to pupil, hoping to benefit more than 8,000 children.

WHAT DOES YOUR SON NEED TO DO TO PARTICIPATE IN THIS PROJECT?

Your son/ward is encouraged to select a toy from his favourite toy collection, wrap it up in clear cellophane paper.

On **Monday, 5 November 2007**, the boys are required to bring their gifts (in a carrier or shopping bag) to school. Our P6 boys will be tasked to collect the gifts from the classes, level by level. They will be supervised by the P6 teachers.

Class teachers will be distributing the gift cards on **Monday, 5 November 2007**. Your son/ward can attach the gift card with a personal message on it for the “unknown friend”. He can write (a) his name, (b) his level (e.g., Pr 1) and a personal message about the toy if he wishes.

On **Monday and Tuesday, 5 and 6 November 2007**, the Class Support Sub-committee members of the Parent Support Group (PSG) will sort the toys/games by age group. Parents, we would like to ask for your kind assistance to ensure that the toys/games are in **good and complete** condition.

The FFTH will collect the wrapped toys from the school on **Wednesday, 7 November 2007**.

Selected P5 and P6 pupils will be sent as ambassadors to the Toy Buffet on **Saturday, 10 November 2007**, where the pupils from the *receiving schools* will receive the wrapped toys.

We hope you will strongly support this project by encouraging your son/ward to be a blessing to the less fortunate children.
