Payment of Miscellaneous Items

A brief summary of the items charged is listed as below:



Item	Description	Cost (\$)
1.	Insurance: This insurance covers medical expenses (up to \$3,000 per accident) related to injuries due to any accidents to and from school, sustained in school or during school-organised activities. It provides 24-hour worldwide coverage against accidents. This is a very small amount to provide insurance coverage for your child.	3.00
2.	School Diary: A useful book for pupils to record homework and for home-school communication. A reference of the school's character building programme.	4.50
3.	Desk Top PVC Cover: This enables pupils to personalise his work space.	2.00
4.	Examination Stationery Fees: For the supply of test papers and writing paper during examination.	3.00
5.	'Reading Awards' Booklet: This will enable pupils to keep a record of books that they have read. It has been given to your son/ward to encourage him to inculcate a healthy reading habit. Dinosaur badges are awarded when he reaches specific targets.	2.00

7.	School Magazine plus CD: This is a full-colour school annual of ACS (P). It is a special publication. If you have more than one son studying at ACS (P), you may choose to place an order through one of your sons.
